Wesley Covenant Prayer

I am no longer my own, but thine. Put me to what thou wilt, rank me with whom thou wilt. Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be employed by thee or laid aside for thee, exalted for thee or brought low for thee. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and heartily yield all things to thy pleasure and disposal. And now, O glorious and blessed God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, thou art mine, and I am thine. So be it. And the covenant which I have made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven. Amen."

John Wesley adapted this prayer from the Puritan tradition that was so important to his parents, Samuel and Suzannah, and life in the Epworth rectory. It informed his theology and preaching. He expected the people called "Methodists" to pray this prayer at the beginning of each new year as a way of remembering and renewing their baptismal covenant.

The Covenant Prayer describes missional life devoted to following Jesus and serving as Christ's representative in the world he loves and is working to redeem. It tells us that being a Christian is more a way of life than a system of beliefs. The Covenant Prayer describes the Jesus way of self-giving and self-emptying love.

As we begin the year 2021, may we be resolved to be at God's disposal, ready to be used in God's work of redemption in whatever ways are pleasing to God.

From virtual Easter egg hunts and Zoom VBS to Online Youth Christmas Party the family ministry team has worked to make meaningful connections and ministry happen.This year I am extra grateful to work alongside of Meredith and C.J., as well as all our Sunday school teachers, leaders, counselors, volunteers, and parents. This year was different for sure, but with all of you and your support we've have continued to find ways to connect our children and youth to one another and to God.

As we begin a new year and reflect on all of the things that we have learned along the way in 2020, it is nice to think about the new ways that we have seen our St. James community exemplifying the values that our Lord holds so dear. Through the lens of love, we witnessed folks reimagining the ways that they connect with each other, as they printed photos of beloved St. James families and stuffed the photos in eggs for an at-home Easter egg hunt.
